



2021 GUIDELINE REVISIONS

The following are changes approved at the November 20, 2020 meeting of the KADB.

County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP):

Reauthorized for 2021

STANDARD GUIDELINES:

Added exclusion household to Scoring Committee

II.A.2. "c. Scoring Committee members and their households may not apply for CAIP funding."

PRODUCER APPLICATION:

Changed Question 15 from "commodity group" to an "agriculture organization"

Changed Question 20 (attendance at producer meeting) to an optional question

CAIP INVESTMENT AREAS:

Animal, Large:

Added as eligible cost-share items
equine face mask, fly traps, cattle back
rubs, hand sprayers, fly tags

Farm Infrastructure:

Added incinerator for all livestock & poultry

Fencing & On-Farm Water:

Added to on-farm water – aeration system

Added to on-farm water – erosion control
blanket

Forage & Grain Improvement:

Added seed hopper/tender

Added rental option for all equipment listed
in section B.

Technology & Leadership Dev.:

Revised Investment Area Name to "AgriTech &
Leadership Development"

Added farm safety equipment such as chaps,
reflective vest, ear protection and muffs

Added tractor steps with handrails for safety

Deceased Farm Animal Removal (DAR):

Reauthorized for 2021; No changes.

Next Generation Beginning Farmer (NextGen):

Reauthorized for 2021; No changes.

Shared-Use Equipment:

Reauthorized for 2021; No changes.

Youth Agricultural Incentives Program:

GUIDELINES:

Reauthorized for 2021

Added "generator" as eligible cost-share item to "showmanship equipment & supplies"

On-Farm Energy Efficiency Incentives:

*This section applies **ONLY** to the state energy program. It is not relevant to the CAIP energy investment area.*

GUIDELINES:

Reauthorized for 2021, allocating a total of \$400,000

Revised submission deadlines: April 16, 2021; August 20, 2021; December 17, 2021

Added "Require separate meter for solar projects. For the purposes of this program, household and agriculture use cannot be combined on the same meter."

Clarified that "installation of the agriculture solar meter" is an eligible cost-share item.

Project Guidelines:

Community Gardens - *Reauthorized for 2021; No changes.*

Farmers Markets - Reauthorized for 2021

Added requirement, "Farmers market applicants shall receive – at a minimum – a high priority and commitment of County funds from the location county of the market to be eligible for state funds."

On-Farm Water Management – Reauthorized for 2021

Clarified that Annual limits are within a program year.

Added proof of insurance requirement for investments above \$2,500.

Added map of proposed project location to required documentation.

Added requirement to Small Scale Grant, "The Applicant must have an established water source."

General Policies:

Added the following to KADB General Policies for any program developed by the KADB:

1. Reimbursements for purchases, including labor, from the producer's immediate family (e.g. father/mother, son/daughter, brother/sister, aunt/uncle, niece/nephew), including in-laws and step family, are not eligible.
2. Documented hired labor is an eligible cost-share item; however, reimbursement will not be awarded for labor provided by the producer and/or the producer's immediate family (e.g. father/mother, son/daughter, brother/sister, aunt/uncle, niece/nephew), including in-laws and step family.
