



RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE EQUINE MARKET VETERINARIAN

- Visually inspect all equids for clinical evidence of infectious, contagious, or parasitic diseases.
- Provide direct supervision for the collection of required blood samples on all eligible animals. Responsible for submitting blood samples to an approved Equine Infectious Anemia laboratory by delivering or mailing the next working day, and insuring samples are received of quantity and quality needed for EIA testing. Samples must be received without hemolysis – or serum samples only may be required for specific markets, especially during extreme weather. When bleeding livestock, a clean, sterile, dry needle and syringe will be used for each animal.
- Responsible for proper and complete identification of all animals bled at the stockyards and for submitting required information on official EIA test charts. This shall include the names and addresses of all consignors.
- Report the presence of any communicable disease condition to the Office of State Veterinarian Representative.
- Cooperate with stockyard management and state-federal inspectors in carrying out all applicable laws and regulations governing the sale and movement of livestock.
