5. Stockyard electronically submits to the OSV Stockyard Multipurpose Forms within 7 calendar days of the sale. (Requires field verification with ADT Program Coordinator to confirm receipt)						
6. Stockyard submits monthly number of animals sold by classification to the Office of State Veterinarian (Requires field verification with Director of Animal Health)						
Livestock Identification (Requires onsite verification on the day of inspection or sale within the prior week)

1. Head Cows are properly identified with Official ID						
2. All Sheep and Goat are identified with official scrapie tags PRIOR to offloading						
3. All Swine are identified with official identification BEFORE leaving the premises
